Wiktor thinks that chocolate is nice especially white chocolate. "Mm it's so nice."

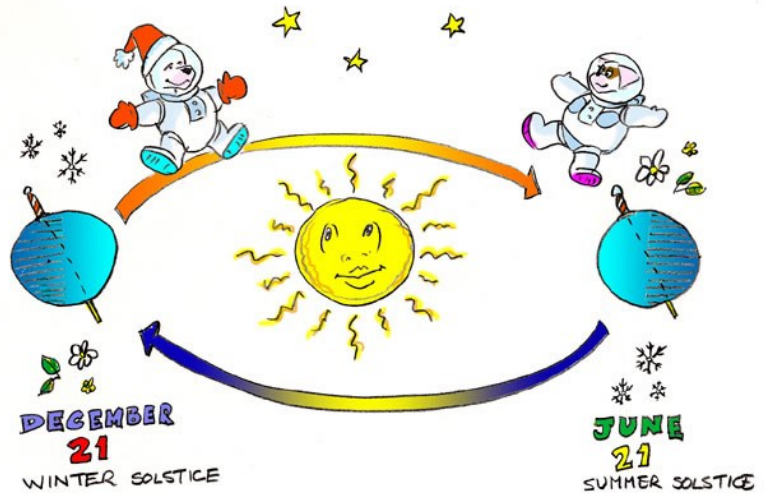
Nisa shared with us "Yes, because you need it, but only a little"

5. Add 1013



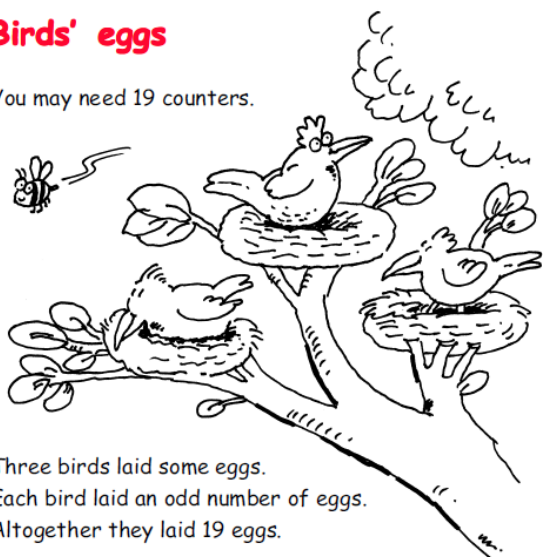
6. Subtract the year you were born
